Baroque Dance

This workshop will introduce the dance style, now known as Baroque Dance, which initially developed in the French court and spread to the Royal Courts in Europe and further afield during the period 1660 - 1750. It was used in social dance at balls, in court entertainments, and by professional dancers on the public stage.

Philippa Waite, Artistic Director of **Consort de Danse Baroque**, is well known as a teacher and performer of **Early Dance**. After training as a dance teacher, she specialised in Baroque dance, and studied with Wendy Hilton, internationally acknowledged expert in the field, in the USA, where Philippa subsequently acted as one of her teaching assistants.

Philippa wrote and presented an edition of BBC Radio 3's **The Early Music Show** on Baroque dance music. As well as performing and choreographing in period style Philippa teaches regular historical dance classes in the UK and is a guest tutor of Period Movement & Dance at the School of Acting, Birmingham City University and the Royal Welsh College of Music & Drama, Cardiff.

Philippa is co-author with Judith Appleby of "Beauchamp-Feuillet Notation: A Guide for Beginner and Intermediate Baroque Dance Students" and is currently working with her on the publication of a collection of new choreographies in the Baroque style to Telemann's Hochzeit-Divertissement.
