# **MUFFAT FESTIVAL**

Georg Muffat (1653–1704) lived through a time of immense political and musical change in Europe, influencing future generations of musicians. He studied and worked in France during the early part of Louis XIV's reign, worked in Rome, encountering Corelli, and then in various parts of central Europe. This was a time of transformation in the musical landscape, with rivalry between old and new factions.

Muffat was the first person to bring French musical language and the fashion for the dance idiom to Germany. His immense skill in fusing different musical styles, be it German, French or Italian made him a true trendsetter.

The Brook Street Band (plus special guests) delves into Muffat's world, exploring the varied musical styles that informed and shaped his music. The Band explores his legacy in the form of chamber and orchestral music, providing a comprehensive and varied musical survey of some of the most important European musical figures of the late-17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> centuries.

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# THE GERMAN VIOLIN SCHOOL

Muffat String Sonata No. 2 in G minor (Armonico Tributo) Schmelzer Trio Sonata in E minor Biber Sonata violino solo representativa in A Schmelzer String Sonata No. 8 in G (Sacroprofanus Concentus Musicus) Krieger Trio Sonata No. 10 in D Biber Sonata No. 1 in B minor (Fidicinium Sacro Profanum) Schmelzer String Sonata No. 7 in D (Sacroprofanus Concentus Musicus) Krieger Trio Sonata No. 9 in G minor Muffat Florilegium Primum No. 7 in G 'Constantia'

The emergence of a new style of violin writing in Germany in the 17<sup>th</sup> century (under composers including Biber, Muffat and Schmelzer) was to have a profound impact on the rise of the violin as a solo instrument in this region. Sensual music for 1 and 2 violins, 2 violas and continuo written by tonight's composers, from the South of the country, is typified by its florid and ornate style.

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# THE ITALIAN INFLUENCE

### The Brook Street Band

Corelli Trio Sonata Op. 1 No. 1 in F Muffat Violin Sonata in D Handel Trio Sonata Op. 2 No. 3 in Bb Corelli Trio Sonata Op. 3 No. 5 in D minor Handel Cello Sonata in D minor Corelli Trio Sonata Op. 1 No. 12 in D

An intimate chamber programme (for 1 and 2 violins and continuo) which explores the Italian influence on chamber music by Muffat and Handel, paired with works by Corelli, the pre-eminent Italian virtuoso violinist of the period.

Today we credit Corelli with providing the template for so many Italianate musical innovations in the baroque era. However, Muffat's Italian-styled violin sonata of 1677 predates all of Corelli's chamber music, and shows that Italian influence prevailed in Germany before Muffat even encountered Corelli.

Muffat's influence stemmed far and wide, incorporating both French and Italian style, and his hugely important legacy is beautifully illustrated in these wonderful works by composers far better-known than Muffat today, but who each owe him a huge debt of gratitude.
